## Agenda item 6: Rally points scoring

Two papers are attached:

- a letter from Adrian Christy (Chief Executive of Badminton ENGLAND) dated 24 July 2006, which sets out Badminton ENGLAND's position at that time the Committee will provide an update on this at the meeting, although in essence their position has not changed and Badminton ENGLAND are actively encouraging all leagues/clubs to adopt the new scoring system

The Committee understands that the Aylesbury and other surrounding leagues have adopted rally points scoring and that by the time of our meeting, HW&DBA will have voted on whether to adopt rally points scoring. As such the Committee is aware that the outcome of the vote at the HW&DBA meeting may influence clubs in deciding on how they wish to vote at the CADBA AGM.

Subject to the outcome of the HW&DBA vote, the Committee recommends the adoption of rally points scoring for 2007/08.
